Invitation to All Swedish Students in the University to be Present.

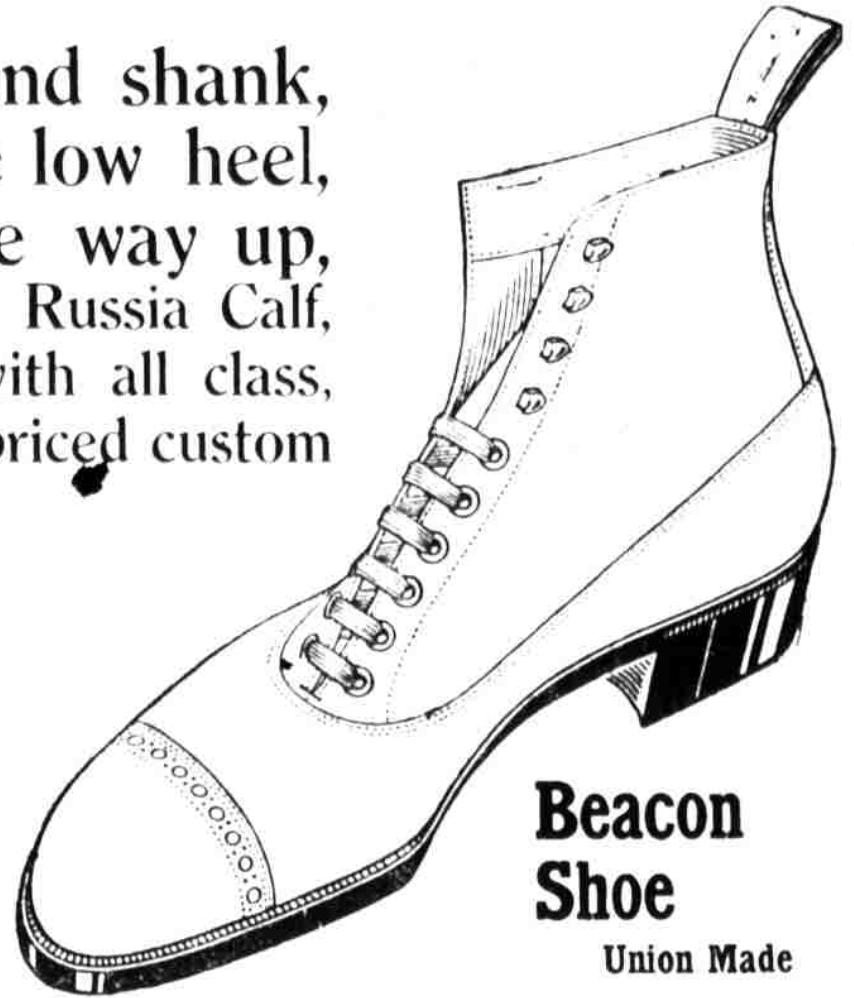
