

MEMOIRS OF MONACON PRINCE

Department of Zoology Receives All Published Results of His Expedition.

The Department of Zoology has just received another of the scientific memoirs published by Albert, Prince of Monaco. It is a quarto volume of nearly 700 pages, and relates exclusively to the molluscs collected by an expedition into the North Sea. The Prince of Monaco keeps two yachts equipped for expeditions of this character, the mass of material which the parties collect being turned over to specialists in the various groups represented, for study and description. BRUNER ON GRASSHOPPERS.

Member of Entomology Department Prepares Paper.

Professor Bruner of the entomology department is preparing a 100 page paper on grasshoppers for the Carnegie Museum at Pittsburg. The paper deals with grasshoppers in the United States, Central America and South America. Approximately twenty-five new species are described and it will undoubtedly be a valuable publication.

GERBER ADDRESSES ENGINEERS.

Speaks at Engineering Society Meeting on Subject of "The Lane Cutoff."

At a large meeting of the Engineering Society Wednesday night, C. H. Gerber, assistant engineer of the State Railway Commission, gave an illustrated lecture on the "Lane Cutoff." Mr. Gerber was one of the engineers in charge of the construction of this cutoff on the Union Pacific, just west of Omaha, and displayed a considerable knowledge of his subject and memory of details of the construction.

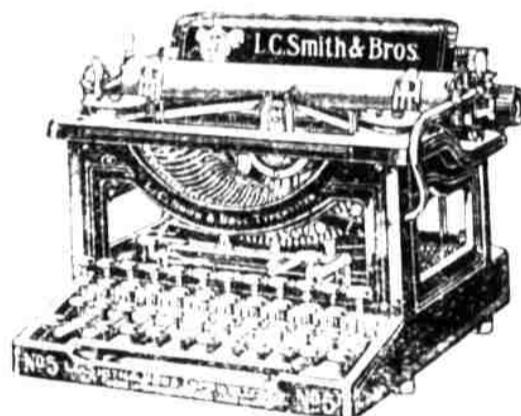
