MANY MEN OUT FOR VARSITY BASKETBALL SQUAD.

SIX "N" MEN ELIGIBLE FOR TEAM

Hanslik Not Yet Out But Expected Soon—Gibson May Come Back Second Semes ter.

Basketball practice has progressed nicely the past few days and each practice sees from thirty to forty men out on the gymnasium floor. With six "N" men eligible Nebraskas chances for making another clean sweep of the Valley look pretty good to the basketball fans. Hanslik is the only letter man that has not reported to practice, but he is expected out in a few days. It was also rumored about the campus yesterday that Jimmy Gibson would soon return, but no exact information could be obtained.

"Skinny" Hiltner, last year's center, is assisting Coach Stehm with the coaching and has charge of the freshmen. All men who are eligible for the Varsity and did not report last year are required to work out with the Freshmen until the first of the year when Coach Hiltner will promote them to the Varsity squad if they show themselves worthy.

Last year the Cornhusker quintet played fifteen games and won all but one of them, which was lost to Minnesota. Four games were played with Kansas, a member of the southern division, and all were won by the Nebraska team. Kansas was champion of the southern division and Nebraska of the Northern. When it came to the seedling of the championship games our southern neighbors became a bit unruly and would not submit to the plans offered by the Nebraska management, and as a result no championship series was played, leaving the championship to the Cornhusker quintet.

This year the Kansas management, according to the Daily Kansan, is trying to omit the Cornhuskers from the Kansas schedule, but it remains to be seen whether or not the two managers will agree today or tomorrow and schedule games. As far as getting games the Nebraska management will have little difficulty, but like to keep on as friendly terms as they can with our near neighbors.—C. L. Y.

MICHIGAN MUST BE IN "BIG 9"

Alliance of Western College Papers to Urge Michigan's Admission.

The Alliance of Western College Papers have initiated a campaign to influence student sentiment towards the return of Michigan to the "Big Nine." Delegates from the papers of the northwestern colleges met this week in Chicago, and decided that "competition between Michigan and the conference colleges is desired by the students and alumni of the conference colleges as well as by Michigan." They find that the principal bones of contention are the training table and faculty control of athletics, and that these problems could be easily solved by a common agreement. The Daily Maroon of Chicago University is taking a straw ballot of the student sentiment as regards the re-admission of Michigan to the conference. It is very probable that the movement will see Michigan reinstated in the "Big Nine."—Wells.
