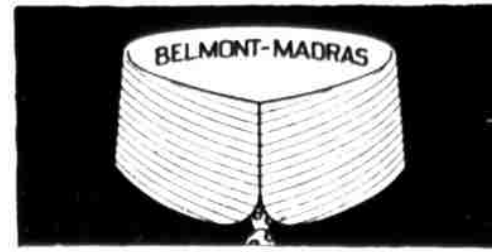
Tickets for the banquet must be secured by noon Friday, and all medics are hereby notified that after that time the tickets will go off sale. B. M.
