

EDITORS TO BE PAID SALARY

Publication Board Favors Compensating Editorial Staff—Effective Next Semester.

PLAN PRESENTED TO REGENTS

The editor of the Daily Nebraskan, together with the managing editor and one associate is to receive compensation for his services on the paper commencing with next semester if plans of the Publication Board receive the approval of the Board of Regents. For some time a special committee appointed by the Board has been carrying on an investigation and has found out that the Nebraskan is one of the few college papers throughout the country that does not furnish financial inducement for those who assume the editorial responsibilities of the paper.

At present there is a rule of the Board of Regents denying the editorial force any such privilege, but it is felt that with the Publication Board in favor of the change, the regents may be induced to alter their position. The plan contemplates the doing away with college credit for work done on the Nebraskan as has been the custom for years. For the present at least the finances of the paper will only support one associate. If the position of second associate is retained, he will serve without pay. The same will be the case of the literary editor.

Another University man has just received notice of his appointment to West Point military academy. Elmer Almquist, '16, of Wahoo, an Alpha Tau Omega pledge, was the recipient of this unexpected good news the other day. This is the second man that has been appointed from this school during the last two weeks. W. W. Cowgill, a resident of Lincoln, being the first to receive the appointment. Almquist and Cowgill will take the examinations in April and if successful leave for the east in June, when the school starts.

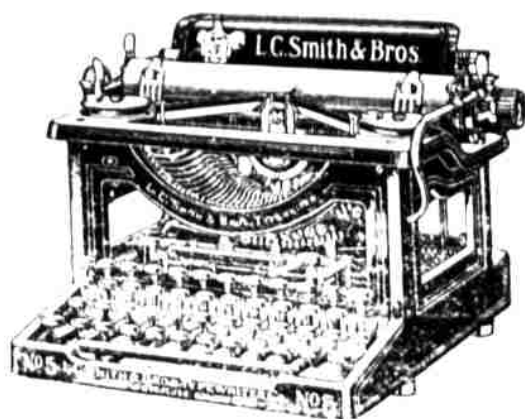
