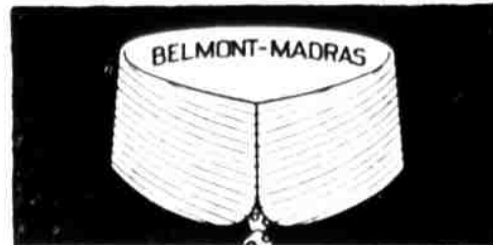
Professional or volunteer social service—the department of political science and sociology.

Village criticism—the department of English language and literature.

Government or state service along botanical, geological geographical and zoological lines—the departments of botany, geology, geography, and zoology, respectively.

Other groupings are in process of preparation, and it may be possible to announce some of them before registration week.

So far as possible, the University will attempt to place the graduates of these vocational groupings, just as it now places the graduates of its various technical colleges. Some of the groupings, however, do not lead to paid employment, but to entrance into business for one's self. Those responsible for each group say they wish it understood that anyone desiring employment to follow completion of that group should consult with the "adviser" for that group before registering for it.



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
