HAGUE CONFERENCE REPRESEN-TATIVE, EDITOR, SCHOLAR AND ORATOR SPEAKS.

UNITED STATES A WORLD POWFR

Says Uncle Sam Set Unparalleled Ex ample of Honesty In Refunding Part of Boxer Indemnity Several Years Ago.

Yesterday's convocation was particularly interesting and instructive, thanks to Professor Grumann, who has very wisely arranged to get men the type of Dr. Edwin D. Mead.

Mr. Mead is president of the World Peace foundation, which was endowed with a million dollars a few years ago by Edwin Ginn of Ginn & Co. He was delegate to the International Peace congress in 1908. As a publicist, orator and an author, he is one of the most widely known men in the east. He was for a number of years editor of the New England Magazine, which is a publication of distinctly literary type and has been president of the Twentieth Century club of Boston, and of the pioneer social service clubs. Mr. Mead is at present devoting all his time to the cause of international peace, and editing of a popular priced library of works of famous authors on war and

The title of his address was "The United States as a World Power," and its explaintory clause "Washington the Expander of England." He pointed

PEACE ADVOCATE TALKS out the fact that Washington and his able assistants had in fact done the able assistants had in fact done the best for England of the two nations in that they had settled the rights and liberties of Englishmen and taught England good colonial policy.

> He gives Uncle Sam credit for inspiring Japan and China and having the unparalleled honesty to turn back to China what was left of the Boxer indemnity fund. "Honesty is the best Policy," said Dr. Mead, "for China in turn has invested the money in American cultivation of Chinese brains."

> Finally in speaking of the Balkan situation in the east, in which the Turkish tyranny is being forced out of Europe, he said that it was American ideas that have shaped the Bulgarian self government and through it the Turks turned out. He gave great credit to Roberts American college at Constaniople where the democratic ideas of our country are taught.
