

WIN SECOND VICTORY

BY STIFF FIGHT WESLEYAN IS DEFEATED BY CORNHUSKER QUINTET

HASKELL THROWS SEVEN GOALS

Game Seems To Be Indicative of What Team Can Do When It Is Put Up to Them—Previous Victory Gives Pep to Game.

Wesleyan was defeated by Stiehm's five huskies Saturday evening, but the result was by no means certain throughout the game. The close fight which kept up throughout the whole evening can be better seen from the fact that the Cornhuskers did not make as many points after the first ten minutes of play as the Methodists put over.

Star work was the exception on the part of Nebraska men, on the contrary the thing which decided the game was the consistent team work which was carried off so successfully at all times. In the second half Ross Haskell backed by a play which baffled the Wesleyans succeeded in throwing seven field goals in quick succession.

Coach Kline of Wesleyan, seemed to have chosen for weight rather than special speed for almost the entire team was heavy, although fast for their weight. Johnson and Garey did the best work against Stiehm's men, although the team as a whole worked almost like a machine and made the boys know what stiff basketball was like.

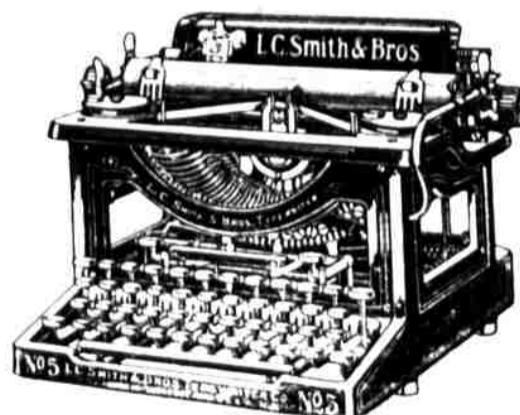
