Plague and Leprosy Specimens Collected by V. L. Anderson on Island of Cullion.

Dr. H. H. Waite recently received some leprosy and plague material from V. L. Anderson who is now in Manila. Mr. Anderson collected material from both leprosy and bubonic patients on the Island of Cullion. Mr. Anderson writes that there are at present twenty-five hundred lepers on the island and about forty cases of plague in the last six months.
