An interesting collection of photographs, taken last summer at the international tournament of the Sokals at Prague, Bohemia, has been received and will be placed on exhibition next week.



At present there are about two hundred thousand Sokols and several thou sand young women in affiliated organizations. Every five years a tournament or contest is held which exceeds in splendor even the Olympias. In the contests last summer there were eleven thousand men and twelve thousand young women and girls who participated

Another group is composed of views of the representation of the Greek victory of "The Battle of the Marathon," which was staged in the open on a magnificent scale by fifteen hundred Sokols and members of the Womens' Auxiliaries.
