

RELAY TEAM LOSES FAST RACE TO SOONERS AT KANSAS CITY

Baker College Makes Best Time in Preliminary Run With Nebraska-Zumwinkle Gets Credit.

In the Missouri Valley relay race at Kansas City held last Saturday Nebraska lost to Oklahoma in the first race of the year by a bare margin of eight yards. The team, composed of Lindstrum, Clark, Beaver and Zumwinkle, were handicapped in comparison with their competitors from the south by reason of the fact that the southerners have been training out-of-doors for a month, while the training of the Cornhuskers has been almost altogether on an indoor track. Against such odds, however, the team put up a gritty race.

The relay teams ran in pairs, the time of the winning team in each couplet being taken and the winners being credited on their time with one competitor. Nebraska, it is said, was well in the lead until the final lap, when she lost on the turn. Baker college made the best time, running the mile in 3:37.

Besides the relay, Nebraska was entered in the 50-yard dash, the pole vault and in the quarter mile. Zumwinkle ran in the final heat of the 50-yard dash, but failed to place, although his work was pronounced by several eastern critics as the most promising of any of the youngsters at the meet. In the pole vault, Lindstrum made 11-6 after running the quarter mile.

The meet was attended by some four thousand people and was made, it is said, a very society affair. Melville Shepard and several other Olympic celebrities ran in special arranged events. Shepard running in the quarter mile against the western champion. Nebraska's next team will be sent next month to the big meet at St. Louis.
