The first few days of spring football practice have practically assured the coaches that it will be a valuable asset to Nebraska's football team: The last few days have seen from twenty to twenty-five men on the field at every practice, all working hard. This number would undoubtedly be much larger were it not for the fact that baseball and track work take up the time of many football men. However, the coach feels that the spring practocc is not so much to teach the veterans of the game as it is to expound a few details to the substitutes and treshman. Last year the varsity had barely gotten well organized when the season closed. With spring practice the coach hopes to eliminate all of this and have a perfectly organized team by the time of the first
