extend through a larger and more effl cient consular service our general com mercial knowledge of South America These are the methods that have gained for Germany her present hold on the South American market, and these, says Raymond, are the only methods by which we can wrest that valuable trade from foreign control.

Mr. Raymond's comments are brief. scientific and to the point. The rhetori cal style of his production is conserva tive; and to those familiar with his fer vid manner of speaking the subdued tone of his presentation seems novel His sentences may betray some anxiety for statistical exactness. His para graphs may sem less vital than me chanical, and his theme as a whole may reflect less of his admirable economic philosophy than many of the brilliant productions he has rendered in our midst. Still this is the first time Mr. Raymond has turned out for national consumption the thoughts of a real student, and we must concur with what seems to us is his policy in hewing at the outset straight to the
