

PLAY TO BE WORK OF ART DANCE FESTIVAL MAY 3

KOSMET KLUB PROMISES SECOND PRODUCTION IS WORTHY OF APPROVAL.

Miss Dorothy Watkins Composes Music—Hold Nightly Rehearsals In Preparation for Friday, April 25.

On Friday evening, April 25, the Kosmet Klub will present at the Oliver theater "The Matchmakers," a farcical society comedy, a local production, the music of which is the work of Miss Dorothy Watkins of the punior class.

The plot of the play is very neatly constructed. The scenes are laid at a summer hotel on one of the small towns in northern New York and time of the two acts are the afternoon of an early August day and the following morning, respectively. The plot arises as the result of complications that ensue from the mistaken identity of a young Harvard graduate, the equivalent of whose name had been advertised in the local paper and that of a college professor and who is taken upon his arrival by the pleasure seekers at the resort as such a personage. The heroine, whose mother is as usual attempting to marry her to a bogus count, fall in love with the young college man. His subsequent efforts to act the ardent lover and impersonate the profound college professor form the nucleus of interest.

The play is replete with keen situations which will require a monstrous effort on the part of the amateur actors to do justice. That the effort will not be absent is apparent from the nightly rehearsals and the double Saturday rehearsals that are being required of the cast. The music is pronounced to be extraordinarily chic and melodious, and Miss Watkins has demonstrated her ability in composing hits that will not be forgotten with the dropping of the curtain.
