**Dream—**

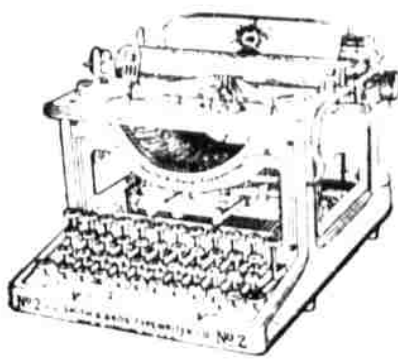
