Nebraska plays its fourth game of the schedule this afternoon when it meets Nebraska Wesleyan University at University Place. This game promises to be one of the hardest games that Nebraska has this year, and a good attendance is expected.

Coach Beltzer announced last evening that the lineup for today's game would be practically the same as the one which went on the trip to Kansas, with the exception of first base. Underwood will take charge of the initial sack, with Jones being transferred to the field. The batteries for day's game will probably be Rodman or Beckoff in the box, with Captain Towle behind the bat.

The team has had a couple of days' enforced layoff, but they really deserved it, for they have been working extra hard. If the sun comes out warm and early today the game this afternoon will be a good one. The team will leave for University Place at 2 o'clock this afternoon, and the game will start at 3:30.

Nebraska Chances Fair For Good Showing in Ames Meet Tomorrow

Coach Reed was not very optimistic over the prospective results of the dual meet with Ames next Saturday, due not to the condition of the team but the track upon which they are to run. A high school track meet held on the field yesterday cut up the track considerable, but if the sun shines and the wind blows good today the track will be in good condition by Saturday. The two teams are about evenly matched, with the advantage slightly in our favor. Nebraska has good chances in the sprints and should be able to place several men. In the long distances the prospects are not quite so bright, but Ames lost their strong man in the distance runs last year in Farquar.

The hurdle races are Nebraska's weak points at the present time, and Ames will have a comparatively easy time in these events. The jumps and the weights are about even, and the result of the meet depends almost wholly upon these events.

The relay races are conceded to Nebraska upon their showing made last Saturday in the Drake relay races.
