FUND IS ALMOST INTACT Eight Men File

STUDENT LOAN DONATION NOT USED TO ANY GREAT EXTENT.

\$600 RECENTLY ADDED

One Hundred Dollars Already Donated by Mrs. Ida M. Carter-Balance Will Be Received in Installments.

The Nebraska students loan fund which at the present time amounts to three thousand one hundred dollars is apparently not taken advantage of to the extent to which one would expect. According to the last report of Secretary itales, the amount paid out on loans reaches five hundred eighty five dollars, leaving almost the whole of the residue in bonds available for loans upon request.

The student loan fund is a sum of money which was last year donated by John A. Waddell, John R. Webster and William G. Whitmore, each of whom contributed a thousand dollars to the whole sum. The Webster donation, of which the interest alone can be used, and the unused portions of the Waddell and Whitmore donations are invested in securities, the interest of which is used to increase the general fund. The loans are made under rules prescribed by the board of regents.

The fund has recently received an addition in the sum of six hundred dollars given by Mrs. Ida M. Carter, one hundred of which has been given, and the remainder to be given in installments.
