Jayhawks Take Track Meet by Heavy Score On Wet Field

In spite of the cold weather, muddy field and heavy track the dual meet between the universities of Kansas and Nebraska was held Saturday afternoon and was won by the Jayhawkers by the one-sided score of 73 to 36. In almost every event the visitors had the locals outclassed and early in the meet it was evident that the size of the score was the only thing in doubt.

Nebraska scored most of its thirty-six points in the field events. Big Big Seven Meyers was the favorite in these, capturing the high jump, shot put and discus scoring fifteen of the Cornhuskers points.

The relay was won and lost by the Cornhuskers in the same race. Nebraska clearly outran the Kansas quartet but lost the race because Zumwinkel and Bates failed to connect at one of the relay stations.

In spite of the weather a fair crowd was out to witness the performance which lasted four hours. The baseball game which was to have been played during the afternoon was called off on account of wet grounds.

Two-mile run—Malcolmson, Kansas, first; Edwards, Kansas, second. Time, 10 minutes 31 3/5 seconds.

Mile relay—Kansas, first (Davis, Cissna, Ross, Black); Nebraska disqualified (Beaver, Howard, Bates, Zumwinkel). Time, 3 minutes 32 seconds.

Pole vault—Reavis, Nebraska and Lindstrum, Nebraska, tied for first place. Height 10 feet 6 inches.

Discus throw—Meyers, Nebraska, first; Burnham, Kansas, second. Distance, 115 feet.

High jump—Meyers, Nebraska, first; Hazen, Kansas, second. Height, 5 feet 4 inches.

Shot put—Meyers, Nebraska, first; Hazen, Kansas, second. Distance, 20 feet 5 1/2 inches.
