Miss Chapman, An Ex-Nebraska Student, Donates Services for a Musicales to Be Given in the Temple Theatre, May 31st

Miss Florence Chapman, who is an ex-Nebraska student and a graduate of the University School of Music, has agreed to give a musicale in the Temple Theatre on the evening of May 31st the proceeds from which are to go towards paying off the Junior and Senior class deficits. Miss Chapman has just returned from New York where she has been studying voice for the last two years under Laura E. Morrill, one of the foremost teachers of that city.

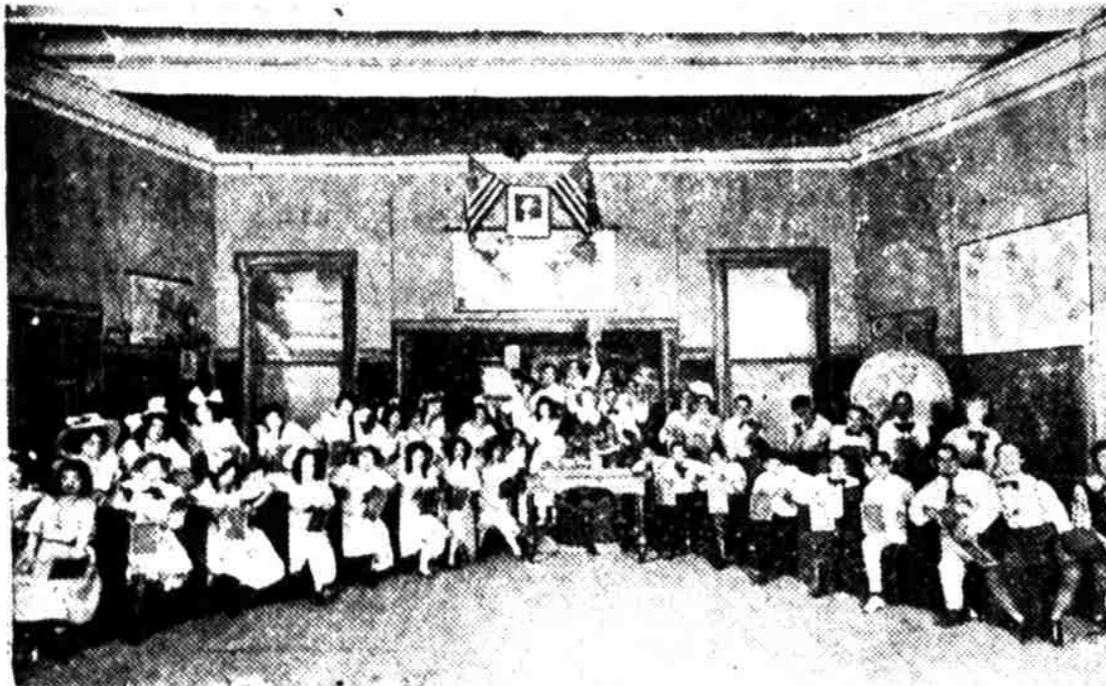
The New York Musical Courier says of Miss Chapman:

"Miss Chapman has been studying with Mrs. Morrill for the past two years and has a beautiful voice, and, in addition, is a thorough musician and an excellent pianist. During the present season she has sung at several

concerts and recitals, among them at Washington, D. C., Woodbridge, N. J., Columbia University, New York; Hotel Majestic, New York, and took part in a light opera given last evening at the Hotel Astor, New York. Her success has been so pronounced that a great future is predicted for her."

This musicale represents another effort on the part of the two upper classes of the University to put themselves on a real financial basis and to establish their credit in a business-like way. For that reason it should and will receive the support of the student body. The affair itself, however, offers a musical treat such as the University public seldom gets the opportunity of enjoying. Miss Chapman has a wonderful voice, and the evening will be a social event which should rank among the first in importance on the coming University calendar.
