

Work Started for Michigan's Return

WOLVERINES HEAD CAMPAIGN

M. L. Toulne, President of Association for the Return of Michigan in Active Charge.

Chicago, Ill., Sept. 18.—(Special.)—Initial steps of the season to secure concerted action among students of the larger western colleges to bring about the return of Michigan to the Western Conference were taken at a meeting of the Association of Western College Editors in the Hotel LaSalle in Chicago today.

The plan of the college editors is to start an editorial campaign for the return of Michigan to the fold. Students and faculty members will be urged to contribute letters outlining the situation and giving their views on the steps to be taken. The campaign, the editors say, will continue until Michigan is listed on the football schedule of the conference colleges.

M. L. Toulne, managing editor of the Michigan Daily and president of the association, was put in active charge of the campaign.

Dispensing of Data.

He will begin at once to send out mimeograph letters to college professors and to influential students at the conference colleges and at Michigan.

Martin D. Stevens of the Daily Maroon will devote the first few issues of the University of Chicago daily almost exclusively to discussions of the Michigan conference situation. Complete reports of the last several meetings of the conference representatives will be published. Correspondence between Michigan athletic authorities and the conference representatives also will be made public if it can be obtained.

Editors of Papers.

The editors agreed to return at once to their colleges and start the campaign. Besides Toulne and Stevens, the other members were: Sidney Casner of the Daily Illini, G. T. Thompson of the Daily Northwestern, and Hugo Buguslowsky of the Daily Cardinal. Minnesota and Ohio State were represented by proxies.

NO ACTION ON RUGBY RULES
