UNI DANCE EVERY WEEK

Subscription dances are not to be attended by students, according to the rules of the University council. Private dances are allowed, when permission from the students' interests committee of the University council has been obtained. "No responsible organization will have any difficulty in gaining permission," said E. W. Murray, chairman of the committee, today.

FEW OUT FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

Not Many Care to Attempt Rhodes Exams—Held Next Week.

Not many candidates have announced their intention to enter the qualifying examinations for the Rhodes scholarship to Oxford University. It is understood that Wesleyan and the University will have at least one entrant each, and a few may enter from the smaller colleges of the state.

The examinations will be held Tuesday and Wednesday, the 14th and 15th of this month. On Tuesday the examinations will consist of translations from Latin to English (9-11 a. m.), Latin prose (1-3 p. m.), and arithmetic (4-6 p. m.). On Wednesday the examinations will cover translations from Greek to English (9-11 a. m.), Latin grammar (1-2 p. m.), Greek grammar (2:10-3:10 p. m.), and algebra or geometry (4-6 p. m.).

The examinations will be held in the faculty room of the Temple with Professor Brightman of Wesleyan, Professor Persinger of the University in charge. Any one desiring to enter should write to Professor Persinger at Station A, Lincoln.
