# Dr. Bessey a Delegate To Conservation Congress—Botany Notes

Dr. Bessey has received an appointment as a member of the Commission on Education for the Fifth National Conservation Congress, which is to be held in Washington on December 18, 19 and 20. He was also a member of the committee last year, when the congress was held in Indianapolis, and from the experience he had at this congress he has found that he will have to make the report as the other members did not show any inclination to do so.

On the "Instruction in Pure Science for Agricultural Students," which is to be read before the college section of the Association of Agricultural Colleges and Experiment Stations which is to be held in Washington some time in November. He has also been appointed to deliver an address before the Nebraska State Teachers' Association, which is to be held in Omaha in the early part of November. The subject of this address is to be "High School Biology: What It Is and What It Should Be."

On October 13 Dr. Cornelius L. Shear, plant pathologist of the United States Department of Agriculture, stopped on his way from the Pacific coast to his home in Washington for a talk with Dr. Bessey. Dr. Shear is an old Nebraska man, having received the degree of B.Sc. in the year of '97. He also holds the degree of A. M. and Ph.D. which he received from the Geo. Washington University in 1906. About sixteen years ago Dr. Shear served under Dr. Bessey as an assistant, having come here from New York to specialize along a certain line of botany. He has lived in Washington for about fifteen years.

Dr. Shear is editor of the botanical magazine, "Phytopathology," and is one of the most prominent men in this line of work.

Dr. Bessey is anxiously hoping that the first frost will not arrive for about two weeks yet, so as not to destroy his crop of native rice. This will be the first crop that he has attempted to raise for some time.
