

PROFESSOR LUCKEY TELLS REPORTER OF EUROPEAN TRIP

Takes Family and Spends Enjoyable Year in Foreign Travel.

A year ago last August Professor Luckey, having been granted a year's leave of absence, left with his family for Europe. His son and daughter having had two years' graduate work in the University, were ready to begin with advantage student work in one of the German universities. They selected for the purpose the University of Gottingen, Germany. Bertha began work in experimental psychology under Professor Muller, and Paul in applied electricity under Professor Simon.

In going to Gottingen the Luckeys went by the way of Montreal, Liverpool, Cologne and intermediary points. In their party were Professor and Mrs. Scripps formerly of Nebraska, and Professor and Mrs. Whipple and son of Cornell.

Gottingen was made headquarters of the family for the year on account of its university interests, but frequent long excursions were taken to different parts of Europe, once as far south as Naples and Capri, and again as far north as Lubeck and the North sea. In this way all of the larger and more important cities of Europe were visited. A week or more at a time was given to London, Berlin, Paris, Amsterdam, Hamburg, Munich, Geneva, Venice, Florence, Rome, Naples, etc.

Professor Luckey was a delegate to the International Peace Congress that met in Geneva, Switzerland, in October, 1912. He was a representative of the American School Peace League. Mrs. Luckey also attended the meetings with him. He was also appointed a delegate to the International Congress of School Hygiene which met in Buffalo, N. Y., last August.

While in Gottingen Professor Luckey devoted much time to study in the university in neurology, hygiene, and psychology.

The little family group of four divided at the close of the year, Mr. and Mrs. Luckey returning home to their work and Bertha and Paul continuing with their studies at Gottingen.
