**Prominent Ex-Dean of
Women to Meet Uni. Girls
at Tea in Art Hall, 2 to 5**

Mrs. W. T. Elander, formerly Miss Ensign, and the dean of women, will meet the University girls at the art hall from 2 to 5 o'clock this afternoon.

For a number of years she was connected with University, graduating in 1903 with Phi Beta Kappa honors. She was elected immediately to a position on the faculty; later she became assistant registrar, and four years ago was appointed dean of women, serving in that capacity until she resigned this summer.

As dean of women, she did much to promote University spirit among the girls and interest in athletics, and it was largely due to her efforts that the girls' section at the football games was established. As a founder of the Girls' Club, she worked untiringly to bring all the University girls together.

In regard to the social life she always maintained the University traditions, and at the same time was liberal in her policy. Her attitude in regard to the "tango" and other fancy dances is upheld by her successor, Miss Graham.

**MISS GRACE BALLARD IS
ELECTED PRES. SENIOR LAWS**

First Deviation from Masculine Rule Ever Known at Nebraska.

For the first time in the history of the University a young woman was elected as president of a class in the law college, when Miss Grace Ballard of Blair was unanimously elected yesterday morning by the senior laws as their presiding officer.

Miss Ballard is the only girl in this class and has won great popularity with her fellow-students in the three years she has been there. At first the idea of a girl taking law and thus feminizing the law college was not looked on favorably by the students, but it was soon discovered that Miss Ballard was the "best fellow" of them all.

She now figures prominently in the truck trials where there is a woman in the case; is invited to all parties and feeds given by the law students, and there was not a dissenting vote when she was nominated as president of the class.
