The weakness in this part of the game was responsible for the loss of the game last Saturday. Some radical changes in the backfield are looked for.

"On account of the mud the forward pass plays that the coaches had worked up for the Cornhuskers were not used, so the team will have these to spring against Missouri. It is the opinion here that K. U. will need everything possible to win from the Tigers.

"The team came through the game in good shape, not a man being disabled. At present the Kansas team is in practically the same position as at this time last year. A loss to Oklahoma and Nebraska clouds the K. U. season this year, while last year Washburn took a shot at the Kansas, yet the team came back against Missouri and won. The followers here are hoping for a repeater against the Tigers this year."
