A MATTER OF ART.

It is too often said that university students do not appreciate the advantages offered them in connection with their general education. That they seek education along special lines, confining their energies to the immediate and personal demands of cut and dried subjects. And that they do not respond to the general cultural influences which the university offers. For this reason the unpopularity of classical subjects is laid at the door of indifference. Art and music receive but scant courtesy.

This week there is an exhibition in the art gallery which could not fail to appeal to the popular idea of art. It has been secured thru the school of fine arts, and comes at considerable expense. Magazine illustrations in color, the originals and their copies when reproduced, from the pens and brushes of the country's best illustrators are on the walls. A number of the popular illustrations in late magazines are shown in the original. Crayon and water color works touch frames with oil paintings, and all mingle in a common democracy on and within the covers of the high class monthlies.

It would seem as tho no plausible excuse would be offered to prevent the gallery being filled at all hours. Were it a technically difficult display the reason would be evident. But as it is the fact that only a small number have availed themselves of the opportunity to see the exhibit would tend to prove the original contention, that the average university student is indifferent to cultural influences. For it is on these little points that the general opinion of student life is formed. And where art does not charm, classics and music fall short also.

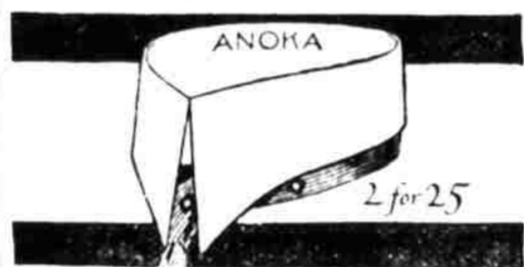
A STATEMENT.
