TEAM TO MEET HAWKEYES LEAVES WITH AMMUNITION IN READINESS FOR FRAY.

**IOWA TEAM ARE RATED HIGH**

Nebraska Has Prospect of Hard Fight With Men From University of Neighbor State.

The Debating team will leave for Iowa City this afternoon where they will contest against the Hawkeyes for honors in debate. The squad has been working day and night for the past nine weeks on the question at issue and are in fine condition for the battle.

The men on both the Nebraska and Iowa teams are well trained and experienced debaters and the contest will be marked by enthusiasm and skill on both sides. Intense rivalry is expected owing to the recent football victory of the Cornhuskers over the Hawkeyes.

**Iowa Debaters Against Nebraska.**

Harry Reed, '15, Law, '15, member of Zetagathian freshman team and Zetagathian Intersociety championship team, 1913; member of Psi Mu, Chi Delta Phi, and Phi Kappa Psi.

Clarence B. Isaac, '14, leader of Philomathian championship debating team, 1912, and of intercollegiate debate team, 1912; winner Egan prize in oratory, 1912; member of Delta Sigma Rho.

Theodore Garfield, '14, member of Zetagathian freshman debating team and Zetagathian championship debate team, 1913; member of Phi Kappa Psi.

The order of speakers will be: First arguments, Mr. Garfield, Mr. Isaac, Mr. Reed; rebuttal arguments, Mr. Isaac, Mr. Garfield, Mr. Reed.

**Nebraska's Debaters Against Iowa.**

Raymond E. Kirk, '15, of Kearney, entered the university this fall from the Kearney normal school, from which he graduated last year and which he entered from the Grand Island college academy. At Kearney he was president of the English club and of the Emanon Debating society and of the senior class. He represented Kearney in four debates with Grand Island and with Peru normal school in 1911 and with Peru in 1912 and 1913.

C. A. Sorensen, '13 Law, '15, of Loup City, entered the university in 1912 from Grand Island college where he was a member of the freshman and sophomore debating teams and was editor of the college paper. He took his high school course at Loup City which he represented in 1908 and 1909 in contests of the Nebraska high school

debating league. He represented Grand Island college in the state oratorical contest in 1912. He was a member of Nebraska's team that defeated Illinois here last year on the compulsory chartering of interstate commerce corporations, the other speakers being Guy C. Kiddoo, '13, Law, '15, of South Omaha, and Byrne C. Marcellus, '14, Law, '14, of Lincoln, who is now at the Columbia university law school. Mr. Sorensen was recently appointed scholar in the department of political science and sociology. He is a member of the Delta Chi, Phi Alpha Tau, the honorary public speaking fraternity, and Delta Sigma Rho.

Otto K. Perrin, '14, Law, '16, of Sargent, was graduated with valedictorian honors from the Sargent high school in 1907. He taught English and Latin in that school in 1908-1910 and entered the university in 1910. As a student he has specialized in argumentation debate, in economics and history. He has made a distinguished scholarship record with 100 hours of "Excellent," a rank of 93 per cent.

Harold J. Schwab, '15, of McCook, alternate on the negative team, in scholarship lead the class of 1912 at the McCook high school, which he represented in the contests of the southwestern district of the Nebraska high school debating league. He was a member of the freshman team last year in the interclass debates. He is taking the six-year law course. He is a member of Delta Tau Delta and Phi Alpha Tau.

bating teams and won a place in the intercollegiate debate seminary last year. He is a member of Phi Alpha Tau.

Harold A. Prince, '13, Law, '15, of Grand Island, entered the university in 1909, having taken valedictory honors at the Grand Island high school. He received the degree of Bachelor of Arts last June with high scholarship rank and Phi Beta Kappa honors. In his junior year he won membership in the intercollegiate debate seminary and was chosen with T. Jean Hargrave of Wymore who graduated in 1912 with Phi Beta Kappa honors, and who is now in the Harvard Law school and Clifford L. Rein, '13, Law, '13, assistant in Rhetoric last year and now assistant to Chancellor Avery, to represent Nebraska in the ship subsidy with Minnesota at Minneapolis. Last year he was one of the three Nebraskians awarded the decision over Wisconsin on the federal incorporation question, the other two being Harry J. Burtis, '13, of Lincoln, instructor in argumentation and debate and freshman in English in Iowa state college, and Ralph W. Garrett of Madison, who graduated in 1912 with high Phi Beta Kappa honors and who is a senior in the College of Law. Mr. Prince is a member of Delta Tau Delta, Phi Alpha Tau, and of Delta Sigma Rho, the intercollegiate debaters' honorary fraternity.

Paul F. Good, '13, (Amherst), Law, '16, alternate on the affirmative team, lead the class of 1909 at the Wahoo high school and was awarded second honor in the state debate of the Nebraska high school Debating League in 1909. At Amherst he won prizes in English, Latin and in mathematics in which he took final honors and he was graduated magna cum laude, having the highest scholarship in the class. He was a member of his class debating teams in the freshman and sophomore years—the only years in which there are class debates. He was a member of the English club, German club and of the cast in the Latin play. He belongs to Phi Beta Kappa.
