ALL CHURCHES MAKE PREPARATIONS FOR BIG ATTENDANCE OF STUDENTS.

CHANCELLOR AND Y.M.C.A. WORK

Every Effort Will be Made to Get all Possible Numbers out to Services.

Next Sunday, January 18th will be University Sunday at all the Lincoln churches. This plan was formulated several weeks ago by the University pastors and the Association Secretaries, and the result is that the churches in the city will recognize Sunday next as all University Church Day. The main idea the committee had in mind was to ask the various churches to recognize the day by having special sermons and services and in this manner try to get every student to attend some church on that day. The pastors of the churches have shown great interest with the scheme and with the aid of the committee are making special arrangements for the day. Rev. E. A. Worthley Methodist University pastor is the chairman of the student committee.

One purpose that the committee had in mind when the plan was originated was that a demonstration might be given to the people of the state that the University student and the University organizations as a whole do not entirely lack that religious spark as has been sometimes alleged. Another object of the plan is to start the church going habit among the ranks of those who have not taken advantage of the opportunity to attend church since their arrival at the university.

The Chancellor has expressed himself as being favorable to the plan and has shown much interest in the event, being very helpful to it.

The committee proposes to get out cards the last of the week, the same to be put in the hands of every student. A few posters will also aid the student in the selection of churches for the coming event, and will serve as a reminder to those who the least inclined to be absent minded.

It is to be a truly all university affair and the student body is urged to turn out and attend some church on that day. Letters have been sent to every fraternity sorority and club urging that all members attend the church of their individual preference.
