"The standing of the two universities in respect to the winning and losing of Conference games shows Kansas has played eight and lost one, while Missouri has played four and lost one. Kansas has played Ames, Washington and Kansas Aggies, losing one game to the Kansas Aggies. Missouri has played Ames and Washington, losing one game to Washington.

"Kansas beat Washington 50 to 19 and 41 to 11 in the games Friday and Saturday nights. Missouri played the same Washington team Wednesday and Thursday, winning the first game 28 to 20 and losing the other 27 to 19.

"Only four more games will be played here this season. Two are with Kansas and two with the Kansas Aggies, February 18 and 19. Thursday night the Tigers go to Ames, Iowa, where they play Friday and Saturday nights."

"Captain Haskell at forward put up a particularly fast game, being the only man on his team who played a clean game. The others resorted to football tactics—and the play of the Minnesotans was none too ladylike."
