### Republican Landslide Every- WHERE BUT HERE

### T. L. NORVAL ELECTED.

### Nebraska Gives A Republican Ma- jority of 8,000 or Better.

The returns from all over the country shows a large republican gain and the reports in the dailies are substantially as we give them below:

Several of our adjoining counties have come back to the republican fold and have elected most of their republican ticket. Valley county elects half of the republican ticket this year and the republicans of Howard county have elected seven out of ten on their ticket and none of the three populist survivors can boast of more than 100 plurality. Judge Kendall the republican candidate for district judge was elected his own successor by a handsome majority. Hall County another here-to-fore hot bed has elected the entire republican ticket and a clean majority of the county board. The vote on states are given as follows:

Nebraska elects Norval republican by 8,000.

Ohio gives a republican majority of 100,000.

New Jersey has gone republican by at least 25,000.

The figures given on New York show a republican plurality of 40,000.

Iowa went republican by over 75,000.

Pennsylvania gives a republican majority of nearly 200,000.

Even old Kentucky for the first time has elected a republican governor, Col. Bradley by a majority of 10,000. This is practically the first brake of the solid south.

Maryland elects a governor by 17,000. Sixty-eight members of the house and eight senators were also elected.

We are still in the land of pop-dom.

It didn't take another issue of the Times to defeat Hayhurst.

E. A. Brown defeated E. S. Hayhurst by springing the bond racket.

The county republican ticket is lost but Louis Bechthold and the state is saved by handsome majorities.

Get ready to irrigate your lands. Another dry season is assured. The pops are still holding fort. What better evidence is needed.

A great effort was made to defeat Ainger republican candidate for township assessor but all to no purpose. Mr. Ainger made a good answer last year and the people was in favor of keeping him in that place. He was elected by a large majority.

None of our republican friends seem to think that there has been quite a large immigration of republicans out of Loup City township. If this is the case there have been equally as many independents who have moved in.

Returns from the Eighteenth Illinois congressional district indicate the election of ex State Senator William F. Hawley, republican to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Edwin Reiman last summer. Mr. Hawley's opponent, ex-Congressman K. F. Lane, failed to carry any of the six counties in the district. The contest attracted considerable attention by reason of the fact that the free silver idea, represented by Mr. Lane, was pitted against sound money.

Rein, Polski and Johnson Re-elected by Handsome Majorities.

Patton for Sheriff and Kay for judge away behind their ticket but got there just the same.

Bissel and Scott Lead Their Ticket With Race Horse Speed.

GREENE'S MAJORITY ABOUT 680

Election day in Sherman county was not only a pleasant one but it proved another great victory for the pops. The above tabulated abstract gives a complete vote of the county. By it, it is plain to be seen that the past administration of Rein and Polski has been endorsed by the people of this county, they being elected by the highest vote cast for any candidate in the county. G. H. Scott and R. L. Bissel republican candidates for judge and sheriff respectively made large inroads in the populist ranks, and undoubtedly would have been elected had Clay, Hazard, Loup City, and Harrison townships rolled up their usual republican majorities.

Louis Bechthold was the only republican supervisor elected in the county. The official count shows a tie vote between Geo. Newberg, republican and Peter McKeon, independent, candidates for supervisor in the sixth district.

The latest news we have on district judge is that H. M. Sinclair carries Buffalo County by about 100 and W. L. Greene carries Dawson county by 300, Custer by 283 and Sherman by 199. This gives Greene a majority in the district of 683.

### NOTICE OF AMENDMENT OF THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE SHERMAN COUNTY IRRIGATION WATERPOWER AND IMPROVEMENT COMPANY.

To all whom it may concern: You will take notice that on October 25, A.
