REPUBLICAN COUNTY CONVENTION.

A Republican county convention for Sherman county, Nebraska will be held in the Court House at Loup City, Nebraska, on Saturday, April 11th 1896, at one o'clock p. m. for the purpose of electing delegates from said county to the convention to be held at Broken Bow, April 13th, 1896, to elect delegates from the sixth congressional district of Nebraska, to the National Republican convention at St. Louis, Mo. To elect delegates from said county to the Nebraska State Republican convention at Omaha, April 15th, 1896, and to transact such other business as may come before said county convention.

From many parts of the Big Sixth congressional district we notice that the name of Judge Wall is mentioned with much favorable comment. His chances for securing the nomination is as good if not better than any candidate in the field.

There is not the slightest consequence that there is democratic criticism of the republican state convention's utterance on the money question. It wasn't built to please the democracy. It would be an impossible job for even a democratic convention to formulate a statement on this question that would please that party.

Every industry looks to McKinley as its protector and defender. McKinley's name is associated with every industry. The principles he represents are as broad as the nation's territory and as comprehensive as the people's pursuits. His name is known to every man in the whole country and his fame is as wide as the world.

The McKinley Club of Broken Bow has secured a special train which will leave Grand Island about 2:05 p. m. and will enable all delegates to the congressional convention which will be held in Broken Bow at 7:00 p. m. Monday, April 13th, to avoid any delay at Grand Island.

The regular passenger train leaves Broken Bow for Omaha at 6:30 a. m. and arrives at Grand Island at 4:00 p. m.

Hon. Judge Aaron Wall, of this city is now the most formidable candidate in the race for the nomination of congressman from the Big Sixth, and we can truly say that in point of ability he stands without a peer in the district. He is an eloquent talker and a logical reasoner. Mr. Wall will go into the convention with a full delegation from his own county, at least such seems to be the prevailing sentiment of the Republicans of this county. He will get the solid support of his party at home, because he is well known to be a man of great ability and can represent the people of his district in a most able manner. Mr. Wall will also have a large following in many of the counties throughout the district and his chances for securing the nomination are exceedingly good.

New York World: "McKinley will be the republican candidate for president. He is already the chosen candidate of the west and south. The combination has never been beaten in a national convention. He will have practically the solid delegation from Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Missouri, Kansas and Wisconsin and nine-tenths of all the southern delegates. He will be opposed by Gov. Morton, as a local favorite in New York; by Reed as the favorite of New England; by Allison, the first choice of Iowa, and possibly by Davis of Minnesota. None of these candidates will have a strong following in any McKinley states, while McKinley not only has the west and south almost in his favor, but he has strength also where Gov. Morton, Reed and Allison are mere local favorites. Recent events makes this plain. Senator Cullom was formally presented as the candidate of his own state, Illinois, by the conventions of Sangamon and Johnson counties. But the seventh Illinois district, to the surprise of every one, promptly instructed for McKinley, and sixteen counties have now pledged their delegates to McKinley. Gov. Morton has been endorsed by the unanimous vote of last year's republican state convention as New York's choice for president, and the convention to be held next week will renew the pledge, but the Erie district has voted to McKinley, and the solid Morton delegation is already broken. These states will go for McKinley: Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, North Carolina, Ohio, Oregon, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia and Wisconsin. They will give him 564 votes. The other states have 345 doubtful votes. Delegates to convention, 909; necessary to choice, 455.

The County Board of Supervisors of Sherman County, Nebraska, in session this 19th day of March, 1896 pursuant to adjournment of March 18th, 1896. Present all members of the Board, John W. Long county attorney and Louis Rein County Clerk.

On motion permission was granted to John Minshall to amend his claim filed on page 636 and to Henry Beck to amend his claim filed on page 616 of claim record 4.

A motion to allow the jurors which were out one night as the jury in the trial of the case of the state of Nebraska vs Alonzo Boone, one day in addition to their claim for the night so engaged was lost.

On motion the claim of Jacob Winkelman for \$8.00 was allowed at \$6.00 the amount of \$2.00 being deducted from his claim, which \$2.00 had been charged for attending to jury in the case of the state of Nebraska vs. Alonzo Boone during one night.

On motion the report of the claim committee was accepted, the following claims allowed deductions for taxes made and warrants ordered drawn on the respective funds to-wit:

Claim of J. M. Russell for \$1.25 was allowed at \$1.00 the charge of 25 cents for nails not being a proper charge against the county.

Claim of D. A. Campbell, Clerk of Supreme Court for \$25.40 was disallowed for the reason that same was not properly itemized.

Claim of H. L. Cook for \$40.00 was passed, the bond not having proof at this time that the land in question was not liable for taxation in 1891.

Claim of E. A. Brown for \$97.95 was allowed at \$83.95 the sum of \$2.00 having been deducted from the item publishing Treasurers Statement for \$14.00 and the item road notice \$12.00 not allowed for the reason that publication thereof was not completed.

On motion county Attorney is instructed to make settlement with C. J. Tracy, lessee of the poor farm within two weeks, upon the terms and order of this board of March 18th, 1896.

Before the board appeared Louis Rein clerk of the commissioners of Insanity of Sherman County, Nebraska and gave notice to this board of the action of the commissioners of Insanity in the case of Catherine Augustine, and insane person, showing that said Catherine Augustine had been found insane by the commissioners of insanity and that she had been confined in the county jail for the reason that the Insane Asylum at Norfolk was unable to keep her, as appeared from the letter of J. H. Mackay, M. D. Superintendent, which letter together with the file in the case of examination of said Catherine Augustine were read and brought before the county board for consideration.

On motion the claim of Howard County against Sherman County was taken up and allowed and credit ordered given on claim of Sherman County against Howard County.

On motion the county attorney is instructed to collect from John Asmusen and Stephen Sekretaria the amounts paid by the county to Aaron Wall for defending them before the district court.

On motion the following resolutions was adopted. "It appearing that counsel for the accused in cases of felony has been appointed by the District Court in former years as provided by section 437, of the Criminal Code, which provide that the court before whom any person shall be indicted for any offense which is capital of punishment by imprisonment in the penitentiary is hereby authorized and required to assign to such person, counsel not to exceed two, if the prisoner has not the ability to procure counsel and it has further come to the knowledge of this board in some of the cases, in which counsel has been appointed at the expense of the state that the accused was able to pay for his own defense. Now be it resolved that it is the sense of this board that the District Court require the accused to produce evidence of his ability to pay for conducting his own defense."
