M. H. Mathews was heard to say one day last week that the populists have come to the conclusion that they must necessarily consult the lawyers on all questions of law making and legal propositions. And this is why they have discarded their old hobby of not electing lawyers to the bench and to congress. Mr. Mathews forgets that not long since he was persuading the "down trodden farmer" to start out in the law making business and show the professional men how to conduct the legislative affairs. Now he practically admits that they failed, perhaps because, as a lawyer, he has an eye for pie.

The criminal cases against Albert T. Nichols, cashier of the defunct Peoples State Bank of Litefield have all been dismissed. The attempt of the county attorneys even with the help of W. L. Greene to prosecute these cases have proved an utter failure. The county has been put to hundreds of dollars expense and the tax payers foots the bill. It will be remembered that when Judge Sinclair was on the bench an extra effort was made by his honor to hold the prisoner and bring him to trial when it was found that the attorneys for the state had made a botch job of their papers. Mr. Sinclair held Nichols by a thread and was highly complimented by our citizens for doing so, although he would have been justified by the law in dismissing the case then and there. But he had done so the last of it would never have been heard. While Sinclair was on the bench the accused was tried, convicted and sentenced, but the case was taken to the supreme court and remanded back for a new trial. We have had populists Judges on the bench ever since and these cases have gone over from one term to another and finally dismissed entirely. And thus ends another chapter in the history of our great reform county government.

Whenever a populist gets big enough to attract general attention it very soon transpires that he is a black sheep. Obadiah Hull of Harlan county was the leader of the populist house of representatives this session. Everybody heard of Hull and he was heard from whenever any measure was discussed. Hull was the "big injun" of the house. It now transpires that all the while he was making himself so conspic-

uous and so prominent as an advocate of reform and was so vehemently denouncing dishonesty he was being carefully watched by the sheriff of Lancaster county, who was patiently waiting for the legislature to adjourn to give him an opportunity to serve an attachment upon him. As soon as the session was concluded the papers were served on Mr. Hull and his grip was attached by the sheriff. When first served the Hon. Mr. Hull claimed that he only had money enough to get home with, but as soon as his baggage was seized he hastened to the sheriff's office and paid the claim in full, without disputing the justice of it or questioning the amount. The warrant was issued for back taxes which Mr. Hull had been shirking ever since he was a resident of Lancaster county. When a republican official is found to be dishonest the populists say the party is dishonest. Applying their own rule to themselves the populists party must be denounced as dishonest, as liars and tax shirkers.—York Times.

Before the opening of the legislature both Governor Holemb and Senator Allen pledged their party to do nothing that would tend to injure the credit or reputation of the state. But it seems they didn't know their men. The deficiency judgment law is something of a calamitous measure and confidence wrecker. Its conditions are such that investors will be slow to seek business within the state. The stay law is to be changed, making the time for redeeming after land is sold twenty-one instead of nine months, as it now stands. Then if you owe a man a thousand dollars and give him a mortgage on land you can let him foreclose, and in case the land does not bring the amount of judgment and costs you can wait twenty-one months, pay the mortgage the amount the land sold for and the debt is cancelled. In that way a one thousand dollar debt may be paid with possibly half that amount. Such is the idea of justice of the average "reformer." But it isn't justice.—Stanton Pickett.
