Weeks and months have been passed in the consideration and discussion of the new tariff bill and now that it has passed the senate and become a law we expect to hear the popocrats say on the stump this fall that it was surreptitiously passed, just as they did last fall when referring to the Sherman act which had also been under consideration for many months.

Brown frankly acknowledges that it hurt him to have to move Bryan's picture from the window and then in the same article he says: "We only removed it however, to have it framed." The wheat market has opened this season at 53 cents per bushel; last year it opened up with only 38 cents per bushel. Corn is worth 13 cents now and before election last fall it was selling for 9 cents. During the last year of Cleveland's administration the highest price paid for hogs was 2.70 but most of the time was down to \$2.00 and \$2.25. Since election the lowest has been \$2.70 but most of the time up to from \$3.30 to \$3.90 and for the past six months cattle has been, and are now correspondingly high. No wonder the sign on the McKinley club head quarters has become an eyesore to editor Eddie, and no wonder he suggests through the columns of his popo-social-craic sheet that said signs be removed.

Sherman county's representative J. M. Snyder, of populist persuasion struck the wheat market one day last week with a few of his surplus bushels and realized 50 cents per bushel. If he had waited a day or two longer he would have realized 52 cents per bushel. Mr. Snyder was reminded of the fact that last year at this time the price paid was only 33 cents per bushel. His only reply was: "God bless the coming prosperity. I am as well prepared to meet it as any man. Who knows but what you republicans will move the world yet?" Mr. Snyder may be as well prepared to receive it as any one but we are inclined to believe that a s he did all he could to defeat the cause that made it possible for him to get a fair price for his wheat, he is not as deserving as some others. However, we are glad to see even Representative Snyder prosper and the only pity is that he either can't see or don't want to see from whence the prosperity cometh.

## WON'T DO IT ANY MORE.

Word reached the officers of the irrigation company Monday that Samuel Johnson, of North Loup, and who is acting for the receiver of the Areadia grist mill had opened the sluice gate and turned the water from the ditch back into the river, thus depriving those who were irrigating from the use of the water. Upon receiving this information manager Pilger, Secretary Mellor and other members of the board drove up to Arcadia to adjust matters and on their arrival found that J. G. Shaupp, who had management of the affairs connected with the ditch at that point, had again turned the water in the race which was fast filling up.

Johnston in the meantime had been informed that he had committed a penitentiary offense (which was true) and became so frightened that after telegraphing for attorney Abbott of Grand Island made all possible speed for North Loup. The offense will probably be overlooked by the company this time but it is safe to say that Mr. Johnson won't do it any more. A careful prusal of the statutes of this state will convince anyone that it is safer for a person to monkey with a band wagon any time than to monkey with an irrigation ditch.

## From The Litchfield Monitor.

Wheat is on the rise. Local buyers were paying 52 cents for new wheat yesterday.

Mr. C. E. Achebach has been confined to the house since Sunday by sickness but is able to be out again.

The Misses Gertrude Eaton, Mable Flint, Maud Ormsbee, Mattie Stevens, Ella Insko and Mamie Murphy are attending teachers institute at the county seat this week.

A. D. Norling returned Saturday from Boulder, Colorado, where he has spent several months looking after the mining interests of Norling Bros. Mr. Norling expresses himself well pleased with the outlook for a crop in Sherman county. He expects to remain in Litchfield at least a couple of months.

M. S. Taffe's four year term expired last week, and A. H. Potter took charge of the postoffice Monday. Mr. Taffe steps out with a knowledge of the respect and good will of the patrons of the office, and a strictly moral and capable official record. He will devote his time hereafter to the business of real estate, insurance and rentals.

A meeting was held Saturday to hear the report of the finance committee which is soliciting funds for the purpose of paying expenses of an agricultural exhibit at eastern fairs. The members of the committee were not all present and it was decided to adjourn the meeting to next Saturday to enable the committee to submit a full report. Those present at the meeting reported fairly good success in their respective districts and it is thought there will be little difficulty in securing the amount of cash required.

The fifty-fifth congress came to a close last Saturday afternoon soon after the tariff bill passed the senate. Regarding the day's proceedings on that all important question a Washington correspondent writes: The tariff bill passed its last executive stage at 3 p. m. today, when the senate, by the decisive vote of 40 to 30, agreed to the conference report on the bill. The announcement of the result was greeted with enthusiastic applause by the crowded chamber. This closed the great labor for which the Fifty-fifth congress assembled in extraordinary session, and after stubborn resistance, at times threatening a defeat, the senate concurred with the house in a final adjournment at 9 o'clock. The currency commission was raised by the house, but was not acted upon.

The closing day was prolific of a series of momentous events, each of which alone would have been of extraordinary interest. The final vote on the tariff conference report and the bill shows that the affirmative vote was cast by thirty seven republicans, one democrat (McEnery), one silver republican (Jones of Nevada) and one populist, Stewart. The negative vote was cast by twenty-eight democrats and two populists, Harris and Turner. Mr. Teller, silver republican, and two populists, Allen and Butler, were present and did not vote. One populist, Kyle, and one silver republican, Pettigrew, were absent without pairs, which was equivalent to withholding their vote.

Although the result was a foregone conclusion, yet this did not abate the eager interest attached to the close of a great contest.

## Paying off Farm Mortgages.

(Chicago Tribune.)  
The farmers of Nebraska have a better method of dealing with the mortgages on their farms than the one preached to them by Bryan and endorsed by a majority of the voters of Nebraska last November.

Bryan's proposition was that the government coin cheap silver dollars, which would have at this time a purchasing power of 40 cents, and that the farmers pay these coins to their creditors, dollar for dollar instead of the 100-cent dollars they had borrowed. Then the farmers would have a clear title to property, which they had never paid for fully.

But the people of the United States decided that their government must not be a participant in a colossal fraud and defeat the repudiatory, rascally scheme. Therefore nothing was left the farmers of Nebraska but to pay their mortgage debts honestly when they fell due or let the creditors take the property. Having had good crops for the last two years they have been enabled to pursue the former course. During the last six months Nebraska mortgagor—most of them on farm lands—to the amount of twenty-eight million dollars have been paid off in dollars which are as good as those which were borrowed.

In many instances the leaders have been desirous to renew the loans on terms more favorable to the debtors. But the latter refuse. Thanks to good crops and his economies they have practiced they have the money to pay up with, and they want to get out of debt. Once out they will have nothing to do with Bryanism.

This determination to pay off debts honestly is shown in other states. The reduction of indebtedness in North Dakota within the last few years has been 25,000, and in S. E. fifty millions. In Iowa the mortgages are being paid off steadily. The farm debt of Kansas has been lowered greatly—more than that of any trans-Mississippi state.

The western farmers are also showing a wholesome unwillingness to borrow money. They have discovered that it is easier to get into debt than it is to get out, and that is the only way to get out is to pay up in full. This policy is hard on the money lenders, who can find no market for their capital, but it is a wise policy.

It is a pity that Bryan has not as much sense as the farmers of his own and adjoining states. They see the cheap money jig is up and proceed to pay their debts like honest men. He is still wandering through the country preaching his played out gospel of silver monometallism and dishonesty.
