

Be sure that fowls and growing chicks have plenty of fresh air at night and that calls for good ventilation in houses and coops.

Plenty of room on the roosts will prevent crowding and make the stock nore comfortable during the hours that it rests and gains strength.

Chicken houses should be kept clean in winter as well as summer, fall as well as spring. Be careful in handling mature geese that they do not strike you with their
