**STEBBINS DISSECTS BRYAN.**

Mr. Editor: The January 19th issue of the Era contains a portion at least of what purports to be the address of W. J. Bryan to the Bryan club at Chicago, and as it is a purely democratic document published in what some people suppose to be a populist paper, it is food for populist consideration. As I cannot get a hearing in a populist paper. I ask for a hearing in a republican paper.

Of Bryan's speech: Paragraph 1st—"The democracy of the nation is still defending Jeffersonian principles." Jefferson never made a public speech in his life. If Bryan is like Jefferson, why does Bryan not keep his mouth shut? In that respect he might at least imitate Jefferson. "Stands by the Chicago platform of 1896." "Coin redemption paper wrong." That is just what the republicans stand for exactly. "There will be no turning back." Of course there will not be. Under that platform no populist will ever get United States treasury notes at a low rate of interest. "New issues will be taken in."
