Last year a plant for Electric power was errected, and so arranged as to burn the refuse. After paying all expenses of gathering the garbage and hanling it to the plant, the net profit from the sale of power for lighting and machinery was \$15,000. The plant cost \$60. 000, just the amount which it svess to the city each year besides leaving a surplus that will pay for the plant in four years.


