The National capital is tussling with a siege of the small pox which has the appearance of being as serious an affair as a session of congress.

And egged on by the idiotic screechings of the little Americans who wanted to get a little capital out of it for themselves. They have now come to realize the fact that that independence which they claim to be fighting for would have been much easier obtained if they had not drove the United States to a war with them.

The liquid air discovery, by Mr. Tripler of New York, bids fair to revolutionize most mechanical branches of commerce in the near future. It is claimed that 3 gallons of it put in a steam boiler will develop 10 horse power, and at the same time increase the amount of itself ten more gallons and run an engine of 50 horse power, and will thereafter manufacture enough of the liquid air to keep the engine running indefinitely without replenishing or costing a cent as far as the elements of power are concerned and nothing to do but look after the machinery. Officials of the Burlington railroad are jubilant over the performance of that company's fast mail trains between Chicago and Council Bluffs during the unprecedented cold weather of the first two weeks of February. The new schedule of the trans-continental mail is fastest on the 500 mile stretch between Lake Michigan and the Missouri River, where the Burlington mail trains cover nearly fifty miles an hour, including stops, or run at the rate of over a mile a minute with stops deducted. Despite the severity of the weather, which was the worst the West has ever known, the Burlington engineers landed the overland mail from the east at the Council Bluffs transfer on time every day save two, from February 1st to 17, inclusive.

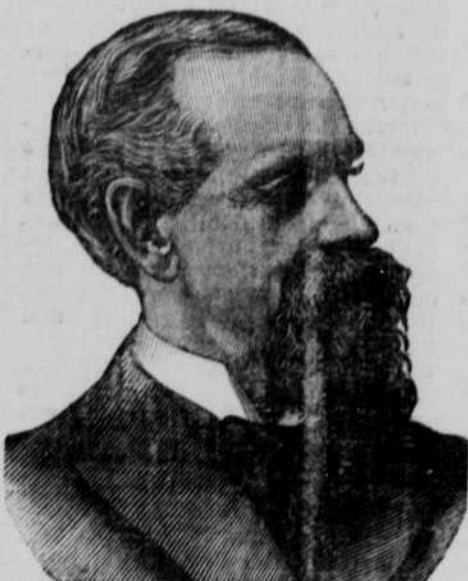

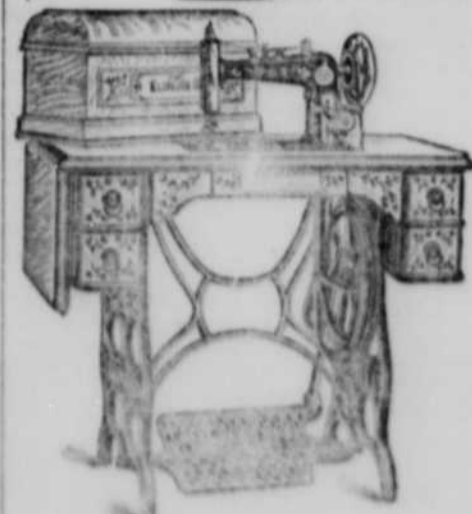
