The adjourned session of the Republican county convention met as per adjournment in Petersen's Hall last Monday. There being no candidates for the offices of sheriff and county superintendent these places were left vacant or to be filled at the discretion of the county central committee. After a speech by Mr. Stevens the convention adjourned. The gentlemen nominated are all of the substantial class of Sherman county's citizens, and a vote for them will be a vote in the right place. They have lived among us for many years, all excepting Dr. Main, whom a short acquaintance suffices to prove him a gentleman. If this ticket is elected our offices will be filled as perfectly as any man could do. It has been the aim of the party to select good capable men and believing they have done so, the balance must be left with the voters.
