FRANCHISE TO THE NEBRASKA TELE-PHONE COMPANY.

(Ordinance No. 57.9 SEC. I. That the Nebraska Telephone Company be, and are hereby granted right of way wires, with all the appurtenances thereto, for and telegraph business through, upon and over the streets, alleys and public grounds of the village of Loup City, for the period of twenty (20) years: Provided: That said company shall at all times, when so requested by city authorities, permit their poles and fixtures partments of the village, and further Provided. Such poles and wires shall be erected so as not to interfere with ordinary travel through such streets and alleys, and Provided: Whenmove along or across any of said streets or alleys, any vehicle or structure of such height or size as to interfere with any poles or wires so erected, the company using and erecting such poles and wires shall, upon receiving twenty-four hours notice thereof, temporarily remove such poles and wires from such place as must necessarily be crossed by such vehi-

SEC. 2. Any person who shall interfere with, cut, remove, injure, break or destroy any of the poles, wires, fixtures, instruments or other property of any telegraph or telephone company or association within the corporate limits of this village, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof. shall be fined in any sum not exceeding one hundred (100) hundred dollars.
