To all those owing me on account, I wish you would kindly pay me at your earliest convenience. J. W. Conger.

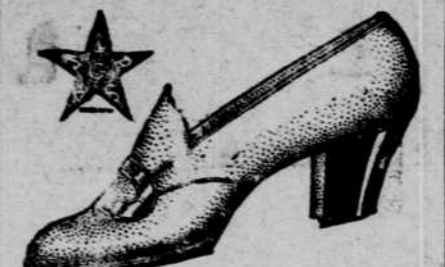
