Woman and Prohibition

State Journal: Kansas democrats this week adopt a platform declaring for national prohibition. When the democratic party in a northern state commits itself to prohibition there is a special reason. Kansas is a prohibition state. That might be the reason. But Kansas has been a prohibition state for thirty years, and never before has the democratic party endorsed prohibition. The reason lies elsewhere.

In the same platform the women of Kansas are congratulated upon securing the suffrage in Kansas two years ago. Woman suffrage is a strange democratic doctrine also. We might suspect that the two innovations go together.

But comes Mayer Dahلمان's frank discussion of the woman suffrage issue in Nebraska to envelop us again in doubt. "If I vote against woman suffrage this fall," he says, "it will be because I am afraid it will mean prohibition. If we have woman suffrage this year, within four years we will have prohibition in Nebraska. And that would set Omaha back twenty years." That explains Kansas. But Mr. Dahلمان adds that woman suffrage will not make much difference, either good or bad. "Ninety per cent of the women will vote as their husbands do. They will vote together, according to their interests." Now, of course, if the women are to vote as their husbands do, they will neither hasten nor delay prohibition. Mr. Dahلمان leaves as ever as to the relation between democracy and women suffrage and prohibition.

Is it not better, anyway, to leave these two questions to pass on their individual merits? There is no more connection between woman suffrage and prohibition than between male suffrage and tariff reform. If women are fit to vote, and saloons are a good thing, liquor men should be confident of their ability to convince the women. Besides, prohibition is not impossible even with male votes.

If liquor men interfere in matters that do not directly concern them, like the woman suffrage question, they are quite as likely to precipitate prohibition as if they attended to their own business and left woman suffrage alone.
