Postmaster-Editor Beushausen seems to be working overtime in his efforts to defeat the candidacy of this editor for representative. As editor of the Times-Independent, which he changed ostensibly into a printing company, when he became postmaster, but which he edits just the same, he loses no opportunity to deride and roast the editor of the Northwestern in his candidacy for representative, nor stops at that but takes other ways and means to that end which seem puny and brainless as well. Poor fellow. Should the writer receive a majority at the coming election, the effect upon poor Beush's knot above the shoulders would require a rest cure for him at Hastings, we have little doubt.

Morehead made a pledge that he would not be a candidate for re-election for governor.
