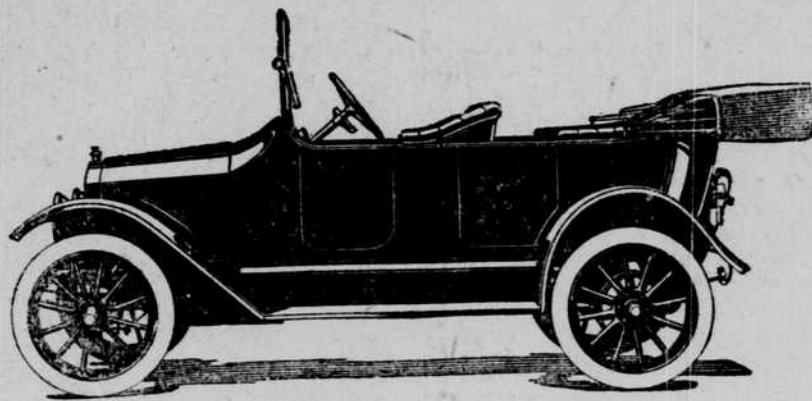

This is the last issue of the Northwestern prior to election, Tuesday, November 3rd. On that day you will make your choice of state, congressional, legislative, county and township officers. For governor, in R. B. Howell you have a man of the people and one who will see to it that the very best government of the state will be had. He is backed up by state candidates for the various offices, who are men of reputation in the state for doing things and if elected will serve the people to the best of their ability. From top to bottom they are men who will see to it that the very best of service will be given to the various offices to which they aspire.

For congress, Moses P. Kinkaid, who has served the district for so many terms in the lower house, is again a candidate and it is unnecessary to commend him to you, as his past service is the very best recommendation he can have to receive your favor once more.

For the state senate, Robert P. Starr has received the most flattering assurances from over the district that his candidacy is received in a most satisfactory manner by the voters, who know him well and know in case of his election that the district will be heard from in the best manner with Mr. Starr on the floor of the senate.

For representative of Sherman county, the editor has received pledges from the various precincts to the effect that the voters will give him a good and satisfactory vote and feels that notwithstanding he has an uphill fight, with a democratic majority against him, his chances are most flattering.

For the county ticket, all look well, with chances strongly in favor of the election of the entire ticket.

His service in that office in the past has so saved the taxpayers' money that they are sure to continue him for another term. W. T. Gibson will nicely carry the west side, and with such a safe majority as to overcome precincts which are strongly democratic and is safe to predict his election. W. S. Waite for district clerk has received splendid assurances from the outlying districts that they will come in with sufficient vote to aid the home town of Wilbur in securing his election by a handsome majority. For sheriff, Uncle Lou Williams has a walk-a-way, or we vastly miss our prediction. He has made one of the most effi-

cient sheriffs the county ever had and since his occupation of that responsible office no fault or complaint has ever been found with his work. The candidacy of Mrs. Heapy for superintendent of schools is and has been receiving the most flattering tribute from over the county. On the west side of the county, where she lives, where she has taught schools for years, and where she is best known, she will receive a wonderful majority, which could hardly be overcome even were there large majorities elsewhere against her, which will not be the case, as from various precincts other than those of the west side also come good words of her carrying heavy vote. For surveyor and coroner, E. B. Corning and Dr. Main have no opposition. In the 3rd and 7th supervisor districts, Bill Brown and Fred Richmond are sure of election. So far as we can learn, it looks as though the entire county ticket, as well as the state republican ticket will be elected by a safe majority.

At the late primaries, E. F. Kozel of Rockville received the nomination on the republican ticket for supervisor from the 5th supervisor district. Being a busy man and merchant of that fine little village, he did not wish said nomination and failed to file his acceptance. Later, voters of that district insisted on his making the race and filed a petition with the county clerk giving him the nomination. According to the importunities of his friends he has accepted and will make the race. Mr. Kozel is one of the most enterprising and aggressive men of Rockville and if elected will give the very best service in his power to the people. Judging by the enthusiasm expressed by the vot-

ers of that district over his candidacy, even the handicap of being nominated by petition will not be sufficient to keep him from carrying his supervisor district by a handsome majority.
