The girls of the high school were allowed to attend the Farmers' Institute to learn about the "Handy Kitchen," provided they wrote a theme about it afterwards.

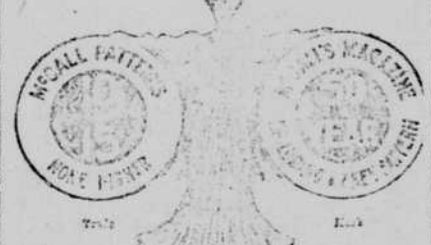
Good Season for Icebergs.
