Teachers Wanted.

Never in the history of the state has there been so great a demand for public school teachers.

The St. Paul Normal College has had calls from several County Superintendents asking for teachers it could recommend.

The new law requires that every teacher, after 1906, must have attended some approved normal school, or have had experience in teaching.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT.

The following proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska, as hereinafter set forth in full, is submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska...

Section 1. That at a general election for State and Legislative officers to be held on the Tuesday, succeeding the first Monday in November, 1906, the following provision be proposed and submitted to the electors of the State as an amendment to the constitution...

Section 2. There shall be a State Railway Commission, consisting of three members, who shall be first elected at the general election in 1906, whose terms of office, except those chosen at the first election under this provision, shall be six years, and whose compensation shall be fixed by the Legislature.

Section 3. That at said election in the year 1906, on the ballot of each elector voting thereat, there shall be printed or written the words: "For Constitution Amendment, with reference to State Railway Commission, and 'Against Constitution Amendment, with reference to State Railway Commission.'"

Section 4. That the secretary of state of the State of Nebraska, do hereby certify that the foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution of the State of Nebraska is a true and correct copy of the original enrolled and engrossed bill, as passed by the Twenty-ninth session of the Legislature of the State of Nebraska...

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the great seal of the State of Nebraska, at Lincoln this 24th day of July, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixteen, and of the Independence of the United States the One Hundred and Thirty-second, and of this state the Fortieth.
