Aldrich carried 74 counties in the state, while Dahlgren had to be content with having the lead in the other 18. Aldrich carried every congressional district but one, Dahlgren's own, the Second.

The entire republican state ticket pulls through, Aldrich for governor by a little over 15,000, the highest, down to Wait for secretary of state, as the low man, with about 300 to the good. Close call and accumulated gray hair for some, before the results were known.

Congressman Kinkaid carried this, the Dig Sixth, district by upwards of 4,000 majority over Taylor. In a letter to the editor, our congressman expresses his heartiest thanks to the editor for the magnificent support he received at the hands of his friends here, together with the work of this paper and its editor. Congressman Kinkaid is well worthy the support accorded him.

Dahlman carried but one county in the Big Sixth—Greeley by 45. And he expected to set the prairies on fire up in the sand hills along the Northwestern road. Brown county did not give him a majority in any one precinct, while Chadron, where Dahlman bloomed as mayor, marshal and sheriff at various times, and where he expected to rope every voter, gave a goodly majority against him.

Right on the eve of the success of democracy in the late election, the daily papers report the price of foodstuffs beginning to decline. The fact of the lower house of congress turning a somersault into democratic arms and a picture of a return to Cleveland times impressing itself on the public eye caused by election returns from all portions of the country, seems to have started the downward trend. We should not be at all surprised to see the history of 14 to 20 years back repeated in this county, unless the people get wise to what it means to nestle in the arms of Auntie Democracy, and not let the old lady's wiles blind them to the consequences.
