HORNED MEN AROUND

MANY PROOFS THAT THEY ACTUALLY EXIST IN MODERN LIFE.

English Surgeon Serving on the Gold Coast Found Opportunities of Making Sketches of These Natural Curiosities—Combination of Horns and Tail.

Men and women endowed with horns are not by any means unknown in the world we live in to-day.

A short time ago Surgeon Lamprey of the army medical staff met with and studied three horned men in Africa, each having a horn on either side of his nose.

"While serving on the Gold Coast," said he, "I had opportunities of making drawings of these people. The first horned man I had an opportunity of observing was a Fantee named Coffea, aged about 32 years, from the little village of Amaquanta, in Wasutu territory.

"The second horned man was a long-faced youth, aged about 18, named Quassie Jabin, from the Gamini territory, and not a kinsman of the first one.

"From a statement made by him through a Fantee interpreter, I gathered that this hornlike growth had been in existence as long as he could remember.

"The third case was that of Cudjo Danso, aged about 20. He stated through an interpreter that so far as he was aware this horn-like knob had grown of itself. It certainly had grown larger as he had grown older. It gave him no inconvenience. He could see and smell perfectly."

Hundreds of cases more remarkable have recently been collected in an interesting report by Drs. George Gould and Walter Pyle, both well known pathologists.

"Human horns," say they, "are far more frequent than ordinarily supposed. Nearly all the older writers cite examples. Many mention horns on the head.

"In the ancient times horns were symbolical of wisdom and power. Michael Angelo in his famous picture of Moses has given the patriarch a pair of horns."

There is a greater frequency of horns among women than among men, according to these authorities.

The combination of horns and tail on a human being would naturally give rise to extravagant superstition. There is a description of such a case in a recent medical report. The creature, said to have been dubbed the "Hoodoo of Plato," was born eight years ago in Minnesota. He was a boy five weeks old when described. He had hair two inches long all over his body; his features were fiendish, and his eyes shone like beads beneath his shaggy brows. He had a tail eighteen inches long, horns from the skull, a full set of teeth, and claw-like hands. He snapped like a dog, crawled on all fours and refused the natural sustenance of a normal child. The country people considered this devil-child a punishment for a rebuff that the mother gave a Jewish peddler selling crucifixion pictures.

Fabrics, the famous Italian anatomist of the fourteenth century, records that he saw a man with horns on his head, and who chewed the cud.

Dr. Saxton reports that he has cut several horns from ears of patients. There are further reports of such protuberances found on the eyelid, the nape of the neck, the lower lip and the chin.—London Express.

HOW HE LOST HIS LEGS.

Cripple Answered the Old Lady's Question, but She Was Not Satisfied.

Speaker Henderson lost one of his legs in battle, but does not miss it much nowadays, as he has such an excellent substitute. "A good many people," he says, "ask me how I lost my leg. Generally I tell them, but I always think of the story of the Iowan who had both legs cut off by a buzz-saw. One day he was riding in a railroad train and an old lady who sat across the aisle from him stared at his stumps pretty hard. Finally she said: "Pardon me, sir; but will you tell me how you lost your legs?" "No, I won't," the legless man replied. The old lady sighed and settled back in her seat. Pretty soon she began staring again, and, unable to conceal her curiosity, she pleaded: "I wish you would tell me how you lost your legs." "The man relented. "Well," he said, "I'll tell you if you will promise not to ask me any more questions. Now, mind you, you can't ask another question." "I promise," said the old lady in a quiver of excitement. "Well," said the legless man, "I had them chewed off."

Dust and Consumption.
That dust is a cause of consumption is clearly shown in the statistics of the patients treated at the sixty institutions of the German Empire for the cure of tuberculosis.

In 1,095 cases, or more than one-half of the 2,161 persons under consideration, the origin of the disease was alleged to be due to the continuous inhalation of dust involved by their employment, as follows: Four hundred and thirty-one cases from the effect of "dust" without more exact designation; 182 cases from the effect of metal dust; 129 cases from the effect of stone, coal or glass dust; 111 cases from the effect of wool dust and 120 cases from the effect of various kinds of dust.

These facts suggest to hygienists and inventors the necessity of devising dust consumers and dust preventers for factories, workshops, etc. This is a fact that legislators should bear in mind.—American Medicine.
