Call For Republican County Convention.

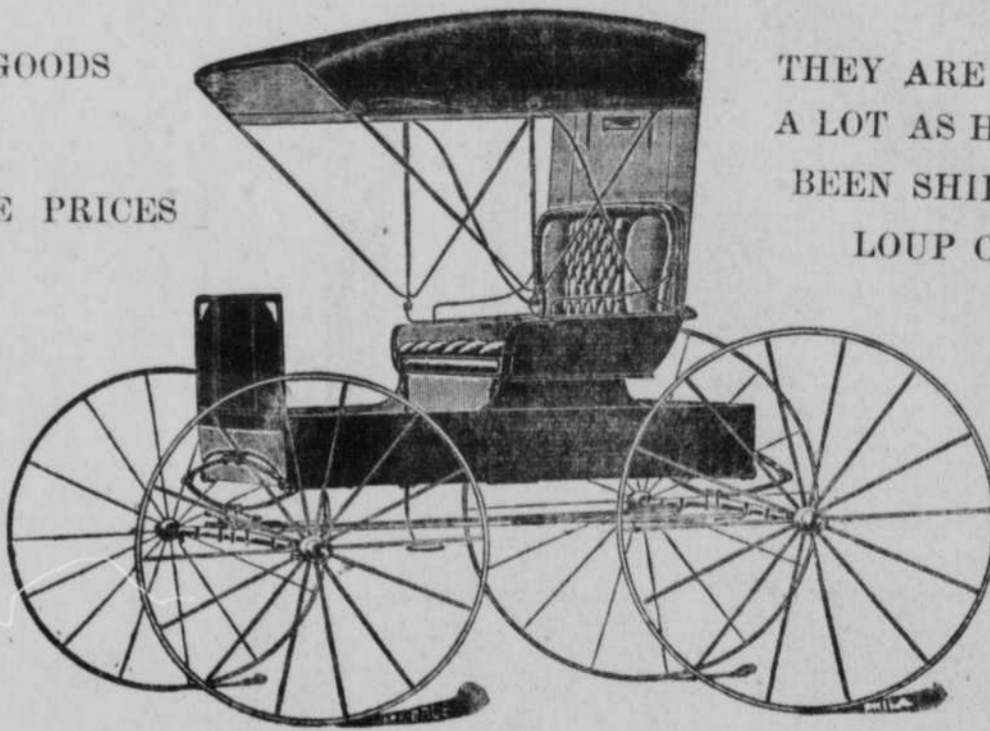
