On that day a meeting of the electors of the districts is called by law. The purpose of this meeting is that the electors may instruct the school officers on "matters pertaining to the arrangement of the schools for the coming year." Shall her work be encouraged by increased wages or by any attention to her location and comfort? Are there schools of only two or three pupils in the township? Could they be closed and a union school be started in the interest of better grading and lower

To sum up-should the school board receive instruction to plan a higher tax levy for their important work? Should time and money be spent in a careful preparation of the school points would be valuable whether an agreement is reached in every case or not. We can afford to economize by spending money on the schools, if we can be sure that they awaken thought, increase pleasure, produce property or raise moral standards.
