In James Miller and John Hearty the police think they have two men who have been wanted for a long time, believing that they were implicated in the post office robbery of 3 o'clock Sunday morning at Dannebrog, Howard county. In that robbery, the building was alpost wholly demolished and parts of the safe were found two blocks away. The robbers got \$275 and escaped on a hand car.
